Our fall athletic programs enjoyed great accomplishments with teams and individuals competing at state in cross country, tennis, and culminating with the football team playing in the state championship against Pine Creek High School at Sports Authority Field at Mile High. 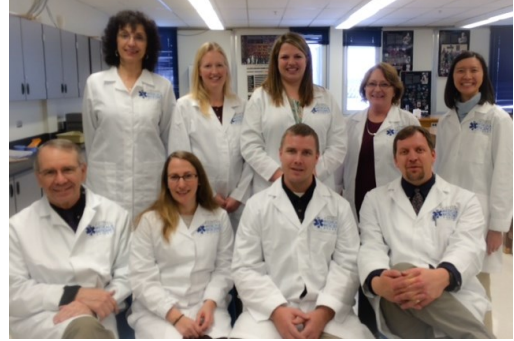
