## **Longmont High School Profile 2016-2017**

### **Community**

Longmont High School, founded as Longmont's original high school in 1901, is a learning community committed to guiding students in becoming productive, empowered, and involved citizens of the world. LHS is an Advanced Placement, honors, Medical and Bioscience focus school in the St. Vrain Valley School. Our diverse student body is 63% white, 33% Hispanic, 2% Asian, 1% African American, 1% Native American and includes a number of international and foreign exchange students each year. Forty-four percent of LHS students are eligible for the Federal Free (36%) or Reduced (8%) lunch program.

### **School**

Enrollment: 1,300 students in grades 9-12 Schedule: LHS follows a two (eighteen-week) semester schedule with 90-minute class blocks. Core classes are year-long and meet every other day. Grades are awarded at the end of each semester.

### **Student Achievement**

2015 Senior Class Statistics: Of those who have reported their plans, 57% are attending four-year colleges; 35% are attending two-year colleges; 3% are attending technical or vocational schools; and 5% are joining the military.



### **Advanced Placement**

Longmont High School AP classes are open to all students. In 2016, LHS administered 399 AP Tests, of which 59% resulted in scores of 3 or higher. LHS also hosts the AP Capstone program.



### **Medical and Bioscience Academy**

The MBSA program, open by application, offers LHS students rigorous coursework, internships, and interaction with health care professionals as preparation for admission to postsecondary programs in medicine, research, and allied health sciences.
