## **Longmont High School Profile 2017-2018**

### **Community**

Longmont High School, founded as Longmont's original high school in 1901, is a learning community committed to guiding students in becoming productive, empowered, and involved citizens of the world. LHS is an Advanced Placement, honors, Medical and Bioscience focus school in the St. Vrain Valley School District. Our diverse student body comprises 60% white, 35% Hispanic, 2% Asian, 1% African American, 1% Native American and includes a number of international and foreign exchange students each year. 42% of LHS students are eligible for the Federal Free or Reduced lunch program.

### **School**

Enrollment: 1,294 students in grades 9-12 Schedule: LHS follows a two (eighteen-week) semester schedule with 90-minute class blocks. Core classes are year-long and meet every other day. Grades are awarded at the end of each semester.

### **Student Achievement**

2016-17 Senior Class Statistics: Of those who have reported their plans, 60% are attending four-year colleges; 30% are attending two-year colleges; 5% are attending technical/vocational schools; 5% are joining the military.



### **Advanced Placement**

Longmont High School AP classes are open to all students. In 2017, LHS administered 420 AP Tests, of which 59% resulted in scores of 3 or higher.



### **Medical and Bioscience Academy**

The MBSA program, open by application, offers LHS students rigorous coursework, internships, and interaction with healthcare professionals as preparation for admission to postsecondary programs in medicine, research, and allied health sciences.



### **High School of Business**

The High School of Business program offers LHS students rigorous coursework and internships with local professionals as well as college credit opportunities. HSoB helps prepare students for admission to postsecondary programs in business related fields.



### CU Succeed Gold

LHS is one of only ninety high schools state-wide authorized to teach these select AP classes for both high school and UC Denver credit; CU Gold teachers hold adjunct faculty accreditation in a UC Denver academic department.
